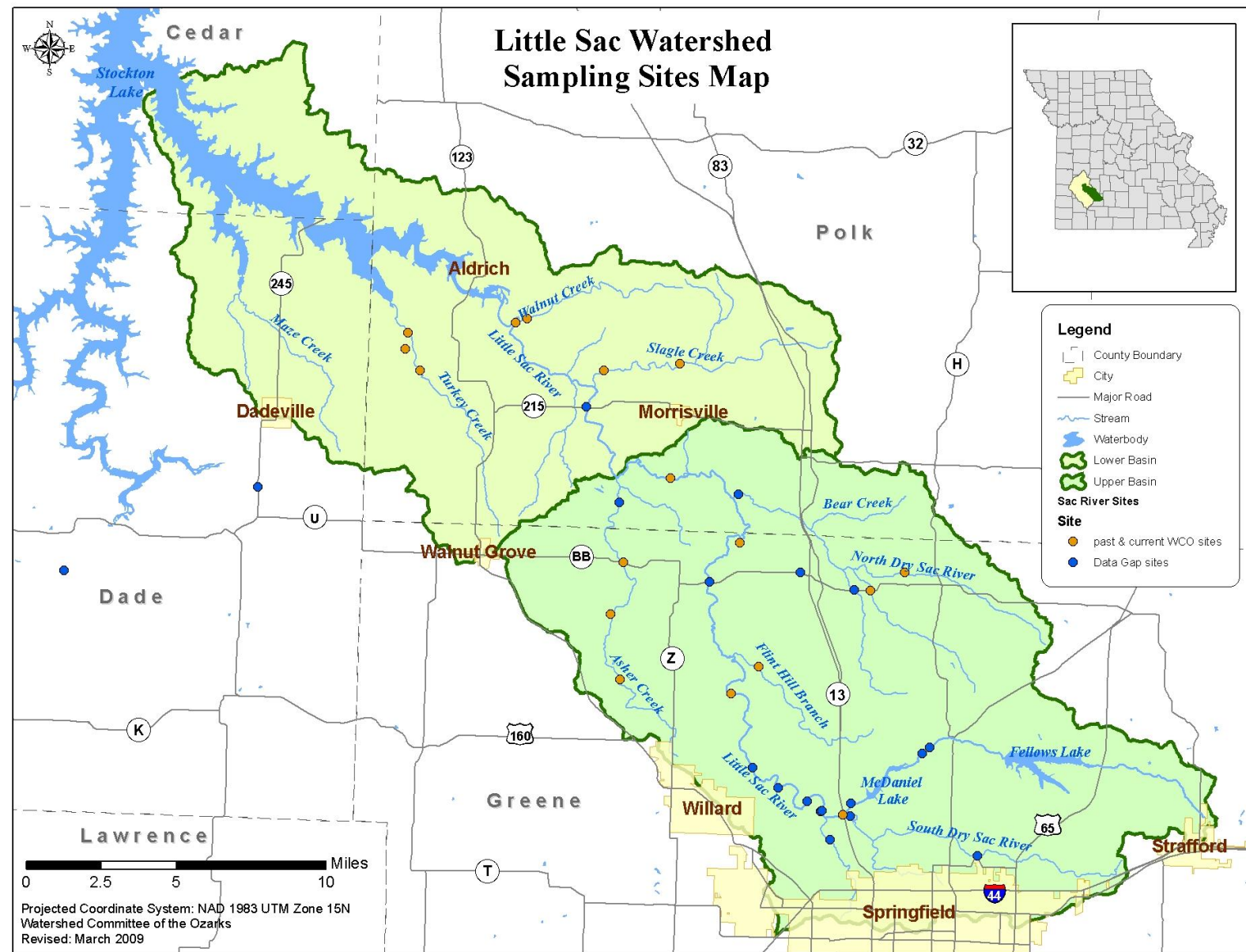

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The Parks, Soils and Water Sales Tax

- One-tenth-of-one percent sales tax
- First approved by voters in 1984
- Approved 1988, 1996, 2006 and 2016
- 2016 passed in all 114 counties in Missouri
- 81% voted for the tax

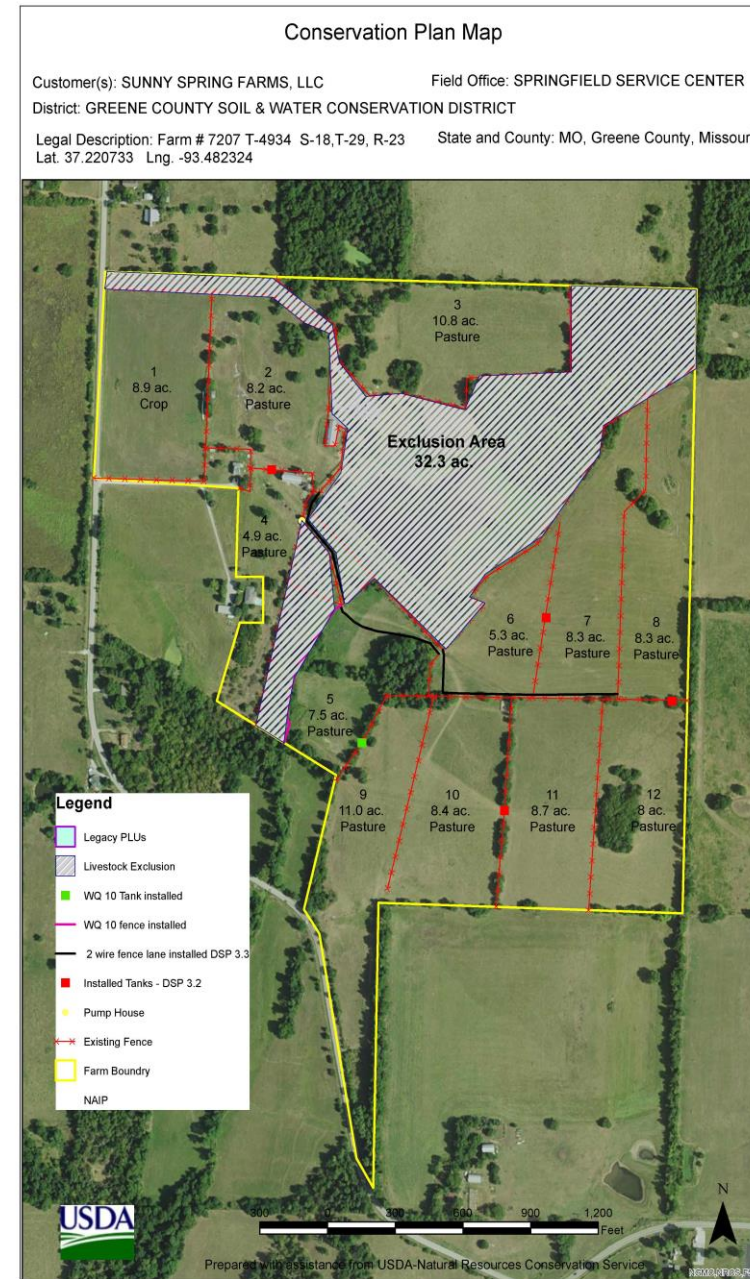
